While the TNFD intensive equips participants with an understanding of overarching systems, reporting frameworks, and nature-related risks and opportunities, the Eco-Journey plays a central role in grounding these concepts in real-life contexts and communities, providing practical insights for leadership and decision-making.

NSS Eco-Journeys are thoughtfully curated overseas learning experiences set within living landscapes. Participants visit conservation sites, engage with local communities and champions, experience nature up close, and reflect on what sustainability looks like in practice.

The Eco-Journey is designed and led by the **Directors of Nature Society Singapore**, in partnership with leaders from regional communities and NGOs.

Why Sepetang?

Sepetang is an example of enduring and effective mangrove conservation in Southeast Asia. Here, mangroves are actively and sustainably managed, supporting biodiversity while sustaining local livelihoods. It offers a living case study of how environmental, social, and economic complexities intersect.

For professionals, Sepetang provides rich, **place-based learning opportunities** that mirror many of Singapore's own conservation challenges, making it a powerful context for experiencing sustainability.

Professional development in environmental education and sustainability through understanding of conservation issues and concepts interwoven with hands-on experiences and guided workshops.



Witness community stewardship in action and understand how nature, communities and livelihoods are interconnected.



Translate insights and learning gained to enhance leadership, programmes and workplace culture in Singapore.

- Boat rides to see mangroves and fireflies

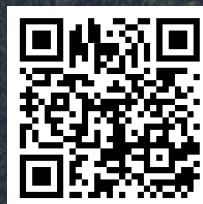
